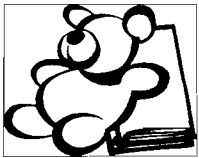

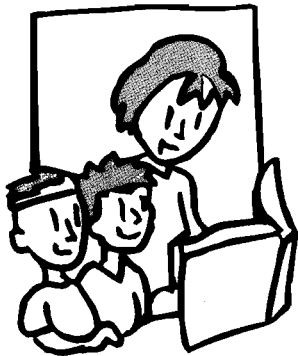

Library trustees to be chosen in May election

There will be two library trustee positions on the ballot in the School District this spring.

The library board is comprised of five library trustees who serve five year terms. They attend monthly board meetings, currently held on the second Tuesday of each month. Trustees also serve on committees which hold additional separate meetings.

A candidate must be a qualified voter of the Fairport Central School District. This means that the candidate must be 1) a citizen of the United States 2) a resident of the District for at least one year prior to the election 3) at least 18 years of age and 4)

must not be ineligible to serve as provided by law. Library trustees are responsible for the determination of library policy and the disbursement of library funds.

Trustees are expected to devote time and effort to the trusteeship, to be active advocates for the library and to be receptive to many opinions and suggestions.
